## **BRIAN RATTINER**

We are excited to be presenting for the first time an exhibition of Brian Rattiner's abstract paintings that will be on view from April 16 - June 1, 2024. Rattiner is NY based, he was born in Brooklyn in 1982 and he continues to live and work in Brooklyn after time spent in Rhode Island while attending and graduating from the Rhode Island School of Design in 2004, and participating in many artist residencies throughout the country and abroad.

Rattiner's abstract paintings are very peripherally inspired by the landscape and the seasons with their allusions to change and temperature and light, often with just a hint of a horizon. Primarily it's the astounding beauty and brilliance of his colors seeping into the canvas and unique silks and satins that he uses as grounds - plus the gestures that barely evoke the swaving of branches and flowers, bugs and birds flying, the chatter of insects, and the sounds of weather - that makes these paintings so fascinating and gorgeous. Nature is noisy and teeming with life and Rattiner's paintings are reminiscent of Charles Burchfield in this regard. Due to his propensity for recording these moments in his preferred grand scale he puts you there, and the experience is that much more intense. With Rattiner's charming ability to evoke and not represent, you swim in waters inhabited by drips of sea life, the sun is dappled over fields of dandelions, and snow glistens on mountaintops.

Brian Rattiner's extraordinary use of serendipity and risk taking, making the most of process while painting, is a key to why his work is so successful and singularly fresh.
